Categories of membership

Active – fully trained child neurologists who have attained the certificate and credential that is recognized in their venue.

Associate – professionals in child neurology training, or training in related disciplines such as neuroscience research, neurosurgery, rehabilitation etc.

Group membership is an option for countries deemed to be low income (see World Bank classification below). Up to 4 individuals may join under one group, and the total fee is USD 120.

Dues are graduated based on a World Bank classification of economies (<http://www.worldbank.org/data/countryclass/classgroups.htm>).

High income – USD 120

Upper middle income – USD 90

Lower middle and low income – USD 60

Senior members may pay USD 20, but they don't get the books.

Associate members (incl. students) pay USD 60.
